Scheduling

Graduate students who have been accepted into a program should meet with their adviser, prior to the start of scheduling, to plan their course work for the upcoming session. Beginning Sunday, February 22, 2009, matriculated students currently in a graduate program may schedule online through their myWCU account. Nondegree students who have not been formally accepted into a graduate program may schedule in person at the Office of Graduate Studies and Extended Education, or by faxing (610-436-2763) their scheduling card beginning Monday, March 9, 2009. (On Monday, March 9, and Tuesday, March 10, 2009, the Graduate Office will remain open until 6 p.m. to accommodate those nondegree students.) Students should register for classes early in the scheduling period. Class availability toward the end of the scheduling period is limited.

The University/department reserves the right to drop from the class roster any student who schedules for course work without appropriate prerequisites or approvals.

Before You Self-Schedule

1. The summer/fall 2009 graduate course schedule (course offerings) is available online at www.wcupa.edu, in the upper gray box under **Searches** and on myWCU.
2. You should contact your adviser before scheduling to discuss what course work should be taken.
3. All University bills must be paid in full and all holds must be cleared before you are eligible to schedule (including tuition, housing, meals, bookstore, library, and parking tickets). You may use your myWCU account to check for existing holds.

Accessing Your WCU E-mail Account

1. Go to the WCU homepage, www.wcupa.edu.
 2. From the Information Resources drop down menu, click **Webmail**.
 3. Under the **Student E-mail Log-In** side, click **Initialize/Change Password**.
 4. Enter your WCU username (i.e., the first initial of your first name and the first initial of your last name followed by the last six digits of your University ID number and then the e-mail domain. John Doe's username might look like this: JD123456@wcupa.edu.)
 5. Your initial (or **Old**) password is **WCU-** followed by your date of birth in MMDDYY format (e.g., Jan. 1, 1986 would be WCU-010186).
 6. In the **New Password** and the **Verify New Password** fields, create a password that is at least eight characters and includes at least three of the following:
 - Lowercase character(s)
 - Uppercase character(s)
 - Numeric character(s)
 - Special character(s) such as # \$ *
- You may not use any part of your name in your new password.
7. Click **Change Pwd**.

To Access myWCU for the First Time

- First access your WCU e-mail by following the instructions above (accessing your WCU e-mail account).
- Go to the WCU homepage, www.wcupa.edu.
- At the bottom right, under **Popular Links**, click on the myWCU icon.
- In the **Sign In** area on the right, enter your user name (i.e., the first initial of your first name and the first initial of your last name followed by the last six digits of your University ID number and then the e-mail domain. John Doe's user-name might look like this: JD123456@wcupa.edu). Then enter the new password that you created when you logged in to your e-mail for the first time.

- Click the **Sign In** box.

Viewing Your University E-mail from Outside the University

All degree students are assigned an e-mail account. Academic advisers, instructors, and administrative offices will be sending you e-mail to this account address. You can view your e-mail using any Web browser or Internet provider. Here are the steps:

1. From your normal browser, go to <http://webmail.wcupa.edu>. Note: Do not use www in front of **webmail**. Click on the **help** button for help in using your webmail account.
2. Enter your account name (your initials plus your student ID).
3. Click on the **login** button.
4. Enter your account name again.
6. Enter your password.
7. Press the **OK** button.

This will put you into the inbox of your e-mail account.

Continuous Registration Reminder

All students who have been admitted to a graduate program must maintain continuous registration each **fall** and **spring** semester. If you are not enrolling in a course, you must request continuous registration. **You are not able to self register for continuous registration.** Contact the Graduate Office at 610-436-2943, and someone in the office will register you for continuous registration; no fees are charged. How to Request Pennsylvania Act 48 Hours/Credits

Professional educators can now request submission of their Act 48 hours to the Pennsylvania Department of Education directly on the Web.

How It Works

- After completing a class at West Chester University for which you wish to receive Act 48 credit, log on to **Edulink** at <http://www.act48hours.com>.
- Enter the information about the class as directed.
- The WCU Office of the Registrar will verify that the hours and credits were satisfactorily completed.
- WCU will submit the verified hours/credits to the Pennsylvania Department of Education records management site.

What to Do

- Visit www.act48hours.com.
- Click on **Professional Educator**.
- Click on **Register** (if you are a first-time user of this automated system), or click on **Log On** (if you have used the system before).
- Click on **Submission of Credits**.
- Enter the requested information and click **Submit**.

Your request will be sent to West Chester University. After we verify that the hours/credits were completed, we will submit your credits to the Pennsylvania Department of Education records management site.

You may check your Act 48 progress at the Department of Education records management site. Click on **Check Educator's Continuing Education Progress** and enter your Social Security number. The site address is <http://perm.ed.state.pa.us/>.

General Fee

Uncollectible Check Policy

A fee of \$25 is charged for any check returned to the University for any reason.

Refunds

Refunds are not automatic, and course or school withdrawal requires written notification to the Office of Graduate Studies. The amount of the refund depends on the date written notice of the withdrawal is recorded. In order to receive a 100 percent refund, a student must withdraw prior to or on the first day for each session. See refund schedule that follows.

COUNSELING AND EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY

Seminar for Counseling Excellence

EDC 595 31 (3 credits) CL#2443

EDC 595 32 (3 credits) CL#2445

July 6–10, 8 a.m.–4 p.m.

The workshops will be conducted in a conference format and provide a forum for discussing current issues and trends, as well as an opportunity for advanced counselor training. Topics may include counselor credentialing and licensure process, laws effecting the practice of counseling, new practices as the result of the Virginia Tech tragedy, training in Meyers Briggs and uses in career counseling and academic motivation, trends in career counseling, changes in ACA Ethical Code, diversity issues, grief/loss and complicated grief, use of humor in counseling, use and demonstration of music therapy, role and function trends of counselors in educational settings, counselor interventions for improving self-esteem of clients, the challenge of eating disorders, counselor intervention for relationship rejection, suicide prevention, drug and alcohol counseling, serving underachievers, and latest research information about what works in counseling. Alternative Counseling Interventions

EDC 596 31 (3 credits) CL#2447

July 13–17, 8 a.m.–4 p.m.

The National Institute of Health reports that over 70% of the population uses complementary therapies. This three-credit workshop explores intervention modalities that are successful in addressing life issues such as stress management, smoking cessation, weight and pain management, and other behavior modification techniques. The modalities introduced include, but are not limited to, hypnosis, neuro-linguistic programming, reiki, and yoga. The course provides students with an overview of these interventions through didactic and experiential activities as well as guest speakers. ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

Differentiating Instruction for ELL's in K-12

EDE 589 22 (3 credits) CL#1568

June 22–26, 8 a.m.–4 p.m.

The course focuses on strategies and adaptations all teachers can use to improve the achievement of English language learners. A research-based model of instruction (the SIOP model) will also be explored. The class will work through the model's eight ele-

ments, from planning to instructional delivery to evaluation, with hands-on activities and discussion, and participants will view videotaped teaching vignettes at the elementary and middle school levels that highlight each element.

Enhancing Collegiality: Supervision and Mentoring Skills for Cooperating Teachers

EDE 591 21 (3 credits) CL#1566

June 22–26, 8 a.m.–4 p.m.

This course affords teachers opportunities to develop knowledge and skills to become effective cooperating teachers. The class will examine and explore techniques that aid in the professional development of cooperating teachers by

- exploring ways for cooperating teachers and student teachers to establish strong rapport and good communication in the mentoring relationship;
- identifying cooperating teachers' learning style and how that style translates into leadership and teaching styles;
- facilitating cooperating teachers by providing instructional support through modeling and developing reflective practice in their student teacher;
- learning and practicing observational skills which may help cooperating teachers gather data during student teacher observations;
- exploring a variety of feedback models to enhance student teachers' growth;
- developing tools that can be used to assist conferencing and student teacher improvement;
- applying what is known about supervision, conferencing, and feedback to daily experiences with parents, students, and colleagues; and
- presenting the WCU Teacher Intern Performance Rating and the Pennsylvania Department of Education 430 Form as methods to convey evaluative information to student teachers.

Integrating a Mexican Perspective in Education

EDE 589 31 (6 credits) CL#1400

Trip date: Guanajuato, Mexico: June 21–28

Class pre/post meeting times: June 3 and 10, and July 22, 6–8 p.m.

Nontuition costs: Airfare, room, board, and transportation in Mexico: \$1,500. (Note: Costs may vary slightly based on changes in the dollar/peso exchange rate and/or changes in taxes on airfares or hotel rooms.) Partial scholarships may be available.

This workshop is designed for teachers,

administrators, and graduate students who are interested in understanding and meeting the needs of Mexican children in schools. The workshop includes a six-day cultural immersion experience of in Guanajuato, Mexico. Workshop participants will have the opportunity to visit Mexican schools; talk with Mexican educators; tour the city and state of Guanajuato; observe firsthand Mexican families' lifestyles; and learn about Mexico's history and culture by visiting museums and historic sites.

Two on-campus evening seminars will be held prior to the trip. Topics covered include Mexican history and values, cross-cultural sensitivity, and trip logistics. As a course requirement, students will complete a project from one of three options: an integrated thematic unit based on Mexican culture, an action plan for tailoring school/family relationships to the needs of Mexican families, or the design of an in-service workshop for teachers on working with Mexican children and their families. EDE 592 41 (3 credits) CL#1408

July 30, 31, August 3–5, 9 a.m.–5 p.m.

In this seminar, teachers will work collaboratively to transform and share their work as teacher researchers with an audience beyond the university and school settings. Teachers will prepare their classroom action research projects and/or other inquiries into teaching and learning for journal submissions, conference proposals, and online community sharing. Teachers will explore print, electronic, and conference opportunities for publicly sharing their work and investigate potential sources of funding for their continued work as researchers. Through the seminar, teachers will identify appropriate venues for their particular projects; prepare manuscripts, conference proposals, and/or grant proposals for submission to selected locations/sources; and examine their role as leaders in the context of collegial professional development.

Integration of Curriculum and Instruction with Global Perspectives

EDE 589 41 (3 credits) CL#1103

July 30–31, August 3–5, 9 a.m.–5 p.m.

This workshop will discuss the rationale of global education and specific strategies to incorporate global education in the curriculum. Designed for teachers who believe students should develop skills for living in this interdependent world, this workshop also benefits those who are interested in developing their personal global awareness in today's environment. This course will be presented in an active learning, hands-on mode.

Supervising High School Publications

ENG 615 40 (3 credits) CL#1014

August 3–7, 8:30 a.m.–5 p.m.

This workshop offers essentials for publications advising, especially for prospective and beginning advisers of either newspapers or news magazines, and high school journalism teachers. Topics covered include writing news, features and editorial/columns, publication production, distribution, management, staff recruitment, and training. Contemporary legal and ethical issues in school publications also will be addressed. At the conclusion of the week-long workshop, participants should have the understanding and competency to advise secondary school newspapers and news magazines, as well as amass information from both printed and Web-based scholastic journalism resources.

Learning Genre Theory through Writing, Writing through Genre, and How Would You Grade That, Anyway?

ENG 615 41 (3 credits) CL#1012

August 10–14, 8:30 a.m.–5 p.m.

In this workshop, participants will 1) choose an unfamiliar genre and draft a new text (e.g., newsletters, blogs, film scripts, or feature news stories); 2) study that genre's features in peer-review and reading groups, as well as create grading rubrics based on group meta-processing of the genre's features and the group's own work drafting those pieces; 3) explore genre theory and approaches to teaching writing; and 4) learn how to apply individual writing and meta-processing to help others with their writing. Open to current and future teachers, as well as those interested in using genre to understand written production, this class will focus on applying hands-on exploration of a particular genre to how one approaches a new genre in general.

Water Quality and Health

ENV 533 20 (3 credits) CL#1908

June 1–4 and 8–11, 5–10 p.m.

This workshop examines the overall state of aquatic systems from a human perspective, considering both people's health concerns and societal needs. The connection between water quality and human health is important because various water uses, such as agriculture, industrial, recreational, and drinking, require different degrees of management and treatment. This class incorporates classroom lecture, laboratory work, and field exercises in a systematic examination of the water quality in the Brandywine Creek. Students will participate in sample collection, laboratory analysis, data collation, and data analysis to develop a comprehensive water-quality report.

Stress-Management Techniques

HEA 511 30 (3 credits) CL#2509

July 20–24, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.

This course addresses the theoretical bases for stress and stress management, the psychophysiology of stress, stress and health, and a variety of stress-management techniques. Coping techniques covered include stress journaling, relaxation techniques, cognitive restructuring, and relationship-building skills. Students will apply the course information to practical activities and assessments.

Substance Use Prevention

HEA 623 30 (3 credits) CL#2520

July 6–10, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.

This course helps students understand the many complex issues and perspectives related to drug and alcohol use in society with a particular focus on prevention. Alcohol, tobacco, and other drug content will include ATOD prevention curriculum and programs, as well as program-planning skills for community and school.

Global Issues in Women's Occupational Health

HEA 581 20 (3 credits) CL#1893

June 3–9, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.

Women worldwide retain responsibility for most domestic and child-rearing work even as they take on more jobs and careers outside the home. This dual role, combined with women's tendencies to work in caregiving professions, increases the psychosocial effects that impact them in both the home and the workplace. A growing number of studies indicate that males and females choose their work based on different criteria and respond to their work in different ways, both emotionally and physically. This course

uses an interdisciplinary approach to focus on occupational hazards and the interactions of women's multiple social and economic roles. In addition, the class will consider the ways in which culture, laws, and economic status in different countries impact women's responses to their work.

Current Issues in Public Health and Health Care

HEA 581 30 (3 credits) CL#2517

July 23–24 and 27–29, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.

This seminar will highlight public health practice as a strategic approach to finding solutions for several, often interlinked, health, economic, political, and social issues, both nationally and globally. Current perspectives and available research findings will guide critical thinking and discussion of challenging public health issues, such as health systems strengthening, workforce development, burden of infectious diseases and injuries, chronic disease management, mental health issues, disaster planning and emergency preparedness, women's empowerment, and human rights. Population-based health promotion and disease prevention approaches, public-private partnerships, and creative resource allocation models will be explored.

Wellness Policies and School Health Councils: Strategies for Health K-12 Schools

July 13–17, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.

This course is designed to help K-12 school professionals develop, implement, and evaluate effective action plans for health-promoting schools. Specific focus is on characteristics of health-promoting schools, building assets to promote healthy behaviors, school health councils, wellness policies, action planning, evaluation, and professional resources.

Nutrition for Health, Fitness, and Performance

NTD 522 30 (3 credits) CL#2548

This course addresses nutrition and its effects on health, development, and performance. Sound guidelines for optimal health and physical performance, energy pathways, nutrients relative to health and physical performance, timing of nutrition, nutritional performance enhancers, body composition, and weight control are discussed.

Students will explore a variety of curriculum integration models, select an appropriate model, and create one unit. Students will examine state, district, and disciplinary standards. Units will have performance-based authentic assessments and show adaptations to meet the needs of diverse learners. The course provides an opportunity for individual or teams of teachers to create or revise curriculum to meet current needs.

Students, teachers, and staff can get work done effectively and share ideas more quickly when they use Google applications and services. With Google applications there's no hardware or software to install or buy. Everything is delivered through a standard Web browser – anytime, from anyplace. This workshop is appropriate for all K-12 teachers and will cover Google Advanced Search, Google Earth, iGoogle, Google Talk, Google Notebook, Google Docs, Google Groups, and Google Sites.

SOCIAL WORK

Social Work in Disasters – From Mental Health Services to Recovery through Rebuilding

SWG 590 41 (3 credits) CL#1082

August 3–7, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.

This course focuses on the characteristics, strengths, and service needs of individuals, families, and communities that have experienced a disaster (whether natural or man made) with resultant mass trauma, deaths, and extensive loss of housing and other material possessions. This course will cover all aspects of disaster relief work. Topics include introduction to disaster relief work, shelter operations, family services, first aid certification, disaster mental health services including the theoretical bases for these services, critical incident stress management, community recovery and rebuilding, and policy development for disaster preparedness and community rebuilding. Disaster

services emanate from various, theoretical perspectives including social systems theory, social learning theory, social structural theory, and crisis theory. Students will learn both how to offer disaster mental health services to those people directly affected by the disaster and to first responders (police, fire, rescue, and other relief workers). Careful attention will be paid to taking care of one's self, both during and after providing disaster services.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Legal Issues in Special Education

EDA 506 31 (3 credits) CL#1386

July 20–24, 9 a.m.–5 p.m.

This course will present information on the pertinent legislation, both federal and state, that governs the delivery of services to youth and adults with disabilities in school and community settings. This course will focus on the past and present significant litigation and legislation affecting the education of children with disabilities. Students will examine significant court decisions and legislations (No Child Left behind Act, Sec. 504, ADA, and IDEA). Attention will be given to challenges surrounding implementation and compliance, and writing legally sound individualized educational and service agreement plans. In addition, students will learn the function and procedures of conflict resolution. Practical applications will include a demonstration of practitioner-implemented IDEA principles, critical analysis of legislative resources, and school-based decision making.

Introduction to Autism: Understanding Autism and the Interdisciplinary Process

EDA 520 31 (3 credits) CL#1392

July 6–10, 9 a.m.–5 p.m.

This course addresses the principles and strategies of an interdisciplinary approach to the treatment of individuals with autism. Faculty from the departments of Communication Disorders, Kinesiology, Psychology, and Special Education will discuss the characteristics of individuals with autism spectrum disorders within the context of their discipline and how to successfully work within an interdisciplinary setting.

Inclusion and Collaboration

EDA 511 41 (3 credits) CL#1034

August 3–7, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.

As students with disabilities are increasingly assigned to general education classrooms, their education is not just the special education teacher's responsibility, but is now shared with regular education teachers. With the movement toward including students with disabilities comes the need for collaboration among all professionals to provide a supportive education. The purpose of this workshop is to prepare teachers for cultural changes evident in American public education regarding the education of students with special needs. Participants will examine their own beliefs about inclusion and collaboration, hear new perspectives on these philosophies, learn how to work collaboratively with other professionals, and learn practical methods to support the needs of all students in the classroom.
