SOCIOLOGY PROGRAM LEARNING GOALS

- **1.** *Knowledge of concepts and theories*: Knowledge of the basic concepts and theories pertinent to the understanding of human societies.
- **2.** Understanding of the diversity of human societies: Understanding that the social world consists of a range of diverse cultures that vary both across and within each group.
- **3.** Research and writing skills: Ability to understand the research strategies, both quantitative and qualitative, used in sociological research. This includes the ability to design a simple research study in an appropriate area in sociology and write a paper that is coherent, logical, and located within a body of sociological research.
- **4.** *Information literacy and critical skills*: Sociology majors and minors will demonstrate the ability to access scientific information effectively and efficiently, evaluate scientific information and its sources, and use scientific information to develop and support a logical argument.
- **5.** Understanding of quantitative concepts and mathematical methods: Students must demonstrate an understanding of basic mathematical operations and must show the ability to do statistical analysis of sociological research questions.
- **6.** Understanding of structural disadvantage: Students must demonstrate an understanding of the ways in which social classes, genders, sexualities, and racial/ethnic groups in the U.S. and globally are socially located and create disadvantages that are built in to the social system.
